<p>Requirements for hire:</p>	<p>Must be in compliance with the Boy Scouts of America National Camping Accreditation Program Standard SQ-412A or otherwise is able to become compliant with the requirements before the start of the summer camp season.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The Camp Commissioner shall either be 18 years of age* or older and have a valid certificate of training from the Resident Camp Director or Resident Camp Program Direction sections of National Camping School; or - Be 21 years of age or older and have six months' service as an active and trained commissioner in the BSA. They also have the Council Commissioner's approval in writing. <p>Must be able to speak, read, and write the English language. Must have great interpersonal skills. Must be in good standing with the Boy Scouts of America, Conquistador Council, and Wehinahpay Mountain Camp.</p>	
<p>Preferences for hire:</p>	<p>Has extensive experience with the variety of programs in the Boy Scouts of America.</p>	
<p>Specific Responsibilities:</p>		
<p>The Camp Commissioner must have knowledge of and be able to demonstrate customer service skills to campers, visitors, and staff and be able to interact with unit leadership in a professional, "Scoutlike" manner. Specific responsibilities include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Supervising, training, and motivating any volunteer commissioner staff in all their activities. 2. Maintain, inventory, and wise use all campsite equipment. 3. Greeting units upon their arrival at camp, assisting in their operations within the patrol system, providing them with immediate help in meeting specific and urgent problems, and ensuring that they are aware of all the available resources and programs within the Boy Scouts of America. 4. Acting as an ambassador to all units visiting camp. 5. Promoting safe, clean camping through the use of daily campsite inspections. 6. Promoting outpost and low impact camping opportunities. 7. Promoting Order of the Arrow and other special programs (ex. NYLT, NAYLE, etc.). 8. Representing the Commissioner's staff at all leaders' meetings and area directors' meetings. 9. Participating in all camp-wide activities as assigned. 10. Submitting a complete inventory of all the campsite equipment, including conditions and recommendations for the following year's supplies. 11. Assist in the set-up and take-down of all camp facilities. 12. All other duties as assigned.
